Letterpress work is done with type collected as various printers moved offset. Joe uses an 8 x 5 Adana

platen press.

Joe's lino practice is evolving. Where possible Joe draws from life, transposes his drawings to lino blocks

using secret* methods, cuts with Japanese woodworking tools, uses a variety of ink and prints and prints

with his Adana or a French stencil cutting press.

in intricate geometrical patterns. They can look a bit like a printing plate.
